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Hey guys, I know that a lot of you are in a spot here where I was a few years ago. You really want to give poker a shot, but you're not sure what the best and most effective approach should be... So I decided to share a little bit of my experience and some tips on how I would do it on 2024:

First of all, here's my graph for my last 200k hands just so the topic isn't all text:

First of all, introducing myself, my name is Max

Lacerda and I'm a professional poker player since 2024, you can find me at the PokerStars tables under the screenname of "maxlljr", I'm also one of the owners of BrPC, a cashgame staking and coaching Poker company.

I first got introduced to poker in late

2024 and it took a little more than it "should" for me to become a pro, and that's what I wanted to share here... I basically spent too much time playing freerolls, then getting the money in the freerolls to play live cashgames, then transitioning to online, then in 2024 finally getting a coach with Saulo Costa (my first and only private coaching), and then things really started to work out in the online environment.

Even tho my journey was (and still is being) very nice and the timing of some things that happened was pretty awesome, I know I spent too much time at the micro/low stakes. And that comes from a few mindset leaks + lack of opportunities that I had...

First about the mental leaks,

I was very reluctant to pay for private

coaching, I didn't know the value of paying for knowledge, I truly believed that I could make everything on my own just watching free content + downloading some books here and there. I couldn't be more wrong.

The value of having someone that just

accomplished what you want to accomplish and can help you along the way step by step is something of extreme value, and because of my own biases + resistance to pay money for knowledge I couldn't give it enough credit.

Another mental leak that I had was my ego.

I really wanted to say that I did everything on my own, I didn't need anyone's help and I was the only one responsible for my own success (which is extremely stupid, because

since the day I was born multiple people already helped me in my life, being the first ones my parents - giving me education, a home, food on the table, and everything else).

Alright, so my first advice for you guys is to simply get rid of all these stupid biases that I had when I was trying to move up in stakes, it will just waste your time and you'll regret it on the future.

Now about the lack of opportunities at the time...

First thing is, all the coaches were very expensive for my budget, I simply couldn't afford them, and I also didn't see anyone that I truly believed on the methodology - mostly from my lack of research to be honest. So even if I wanted, in most of my micro career, I wouldn't be able to afford it.

The other thing was the lack

of opportunity to get coached without having to pay for it upfront. I didn't know any cash game staking team which would give me the money to play + give me coaching in exchange for a % of my profits. Most of what came close to that were the CFP deals (a business model in which you play with your own money, get coached, and pay for it by sharing your profits), which I don't think is a very good deal for micro/low stakes players. And even if I wanted to join a CFP, I should already be playing NL50 or higher to have a shot.

So basically because of everything I wrote above, I believe I spent too much time and the micros banging my head against the wall, not knowing what was going wrong.

So my advice for you guys is: get a coach as soon as possible. At this day and age, with all the opportunities that we have around us, it's a complete waste of your time to do everything on your own. Ofc, being one of the owners of BrPC I recommend you joining us, with the new Microstakes division we accept players that are playing as low as NL2, offering a full staking deal...

But anyways, if you don't want to stick with us

for any reason, simply search for another staking deal. If you get into a good one I'm sure you won't regret it (and there are some very good out there!), you'll achieve your goals much faster than you would on your own. A lot of staking deals have a lot of cases of players joining at nl50 and playing nl500 after one year. By not needing to build your bankroll + pay for your private coaching, your evolution will be much faster.

I'm not talking about hiring a private coaching because most of you won't have the budget to do so. I was extremely lucky to have found Saulo at the begging of his coaching career and being his first student. If I had found him just 3 months after I did, I wouldn't be able to pay for it, and who knows where I'd be nowadays... But if you're able to find a good coach for a fair price, that's another very good option, having full 1v1 attention from a person you trust and that already achieved the results you want is the nuts!

Also, even if you're in a CFP/Stake/with a private coach, I see a lot of value of subscribing to a site like RIO, after you know what you want out of your poker studies, navigating through here will be much easier and you'll make much more out of it!

So that's it guys, I wrote everything here from the bottom of my heart.

I really respect and identify with people that have a great desire to succeed, I really want to help them in any way, I know what Poker was able to give me in my life, and I know the change that it can do in others lives.

That's it guys, I hope I could help you

in any way, and for those about to put in the hard and smart work in practice, I wish all the success in the world for you, no matter which path you decide to take. Poker is

an awesome opportunity for those willing to give it all, so let's not waste it.

The

thing is, you want to have a successful career, so start investing on it.

## **pokerstars en :bwin pt**

Uma fila de discussão entre os bolsistas da Royal Society do Reino Unido sobre a perspectiva para reeleger seu ex-presidente 1 Sir Paul Nurse como chefe desta instituição.

O Guardian entende que o conselho da sociedade apresentou a enfermeira, geneticista e ganhadora 1 do Prêmio Nobel como candidata preferida para esse papel.

A enfermeira foi chefe da instituição de 2010 a 2024.

Fellows da academia 1 nacional de ciências do Reino Unido estão agora sendo convidados a votar para aceitar ou rejeitar Enfermeira como presidente eleito, 1 com o levantamento previsto ser fechado no final deste mês.

No entanto, os bolsistas estão divididos sobre a perspectiva e alguns 1 argumentam que dá impressão de uma organização como o mais antigo academia científica independente do mundo é um "clube dos 1 meninos". A Royal Society nunca teve presidente mulher.

Um sujeito, que desejava permanecer anônimo disse ao jornal britânico The Guardian: "Enquanto 1 a enfermeira tinha um excelente histórico como cientista eles estavam preocupados com o fato de ele ter tido muito poder 1 e influência sobre as ciências do Reino Unido".

"Acho que é ruim para a ciência do Reino Unido estar na vanguarda, 1 ou pokerstars en tal posição de poder durante tanto tempo", disseram eles.

O sujeito acrescentou que a sociedade precisava ter novas vozes 1 e estar aberta para diferentes tipos de voz.

"É uma má aparência para a sociedade que, se não conseguem encontrar entre 1 1.500 cientistas ilustres outros capazes de guiá-los pokerstars en novas direções", disse o pesquisador.

Eles também levantaram preocupações de que, quando a 1 enfermeira se retirar pela segunda vez ele teria 81 anos. "Isso cria uma impressão e um clube do estabelecimento pokerstars en 1 Londres para todos os meninos", disseram eles".

O sujeito disse que havia uma tradição de 200 anos, não eleger um 1 presidente duas vezes. "E parece haver nenhuma razão realmente boa para fazê-lo neste momento", acrescentaram eles".

Outro colega disse que 1 achavam a enfermeira ter feito um excelente trabalho na primeira vez e de como seria seguro se fosse reeleito. Mas 1 eles disseram: "Eu teria gostado -e acho, muitos teriam desejado – ver o primeiro presidente feminino da Royal Society".

Fundada pokerstars en 1 1660 por luminares, incluindo Robert Boyle e Christopher Wren (o

primeiro presidente da Royal Society), a Sociedade Real foi liderada 1 pelo governo de 62 homens.

Um único presidente serviu mais de uma vez: Sir James Burrow, que ocupou duas vezes o 1 cargo – embora por apenas alguns meses. Em ambas as ocasiões ele assumiu a régua após pokerstars en morte

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No entanto, vários presidentes serviram por mais de cinco anos com o limite atual prazo estabelecido 1 no século XIX. Entre eles estava William Brouncker primeiro Presidente que ocupou a posição durante 15 ano enquanto Isaac 1 Newton foi eleito para 24 e Joseph Bankes há 40 ou menos tempo; entre outros:

Vários colegas apoiam a reeleição de 1 Enfermeira, dizendo que ele tem excelentes credenciais científicas e acadêmicas. é um bom comunicador sendo persuasivo ou diplomático; possui experiência 1 trabalhando com o governo

Enfermeira foi presidente da Universidade Rockefeller nos EUA, CEO do Cancer Research UK e o primeiro diretor-chefe 1 de Francis Crick Institute.

Um membro da Royal Society disse que alguns candidatos pokerstars en potencial podem não ter desejado permanecer na 1 posição de cinco anos, especialmente se estiverem envolvidos com pesquisas ativas.

Eles também observaram que havia várias mulheres na lista de 1 cinco pessoas, mas depois do processo completo da entrevista a enfermeira foi considerada como sendo o melhor para esse papel.

"Paul 1 Nurse tem uma enorme reputação, excelente pokerstars en todos os sentidos", disseram eles.

Um porta-voz da Royal Society disse: "A Real Sociedade 1 está pokerstars en processo de eleição do nosso próximo presidente. A escolha é decidida e confidencial para a bolsa, mas não 1 pode comentar sobre uma votação que esteja acontecendo."

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
